# What is the Technical Assistance Collaborative (TAC)?

- Partnership between Michigan State
  University, the University of Michigan,
  and Wayne State University in
  collaboration with Michigan
  Department of Health and Human
  Services
- Goal: Provide technical assistance and expertise to communities receiving opioid settlement funds
- **Focus:** Evidence-based, best practices to reduce opioid overdose deaths

#### What We Do



Guidance for Fund Utilization: Offer planning and process-level guidance to communities for effective use of opioid settlement funds



**Education and Training:** Provide opportunities for community members to enhance their awareness and understanding of opioid-related issues



Community Needs Assessment: Identify specific community needs related to opioid misuse, treatment, prevention, and harm reduction strategies



Ongoing Assessment: Ensure community needs are continually evaluated and addressed throughout the duration of the opioid settlement fund allocation period

#### **Opioid Settlement in Michigan**

- Settlement funds will be distributed over an 18-year period, starting in January 2023
- 50% of the settlement funds will be directly allocated to county and local governments
- 70% of the funds must be dedicated to future opioid remediation efforts
- Settlement payments must be used for opioid remediation
